

## Portfolio Presentation

In the spring of your junior year, you will give a 3 to 5 minute informal (seated in a circle) presentation to your peers. Your audience will be members of your advisory and a tenth grade advisory group. You must complete this presentation for your portfolio to be labeled proficient. Failure to present to the advisory group on your assigned day, or giving an inadequate performance on that day, means you will have to present to a panel of administrators.

To help you prepare for the presentation, examine your answers to your Final Portfolio Reflection.

Your Portfolio Presentation should follow this basic structure:

1. Briefly introduce yourself. (You might tell us some of your interests, or what you plan to do after high school. This should take 30 seconds to 1 minute)
2. Discuss two or three of the ideas you wrote about in your Final Reflection. You may show actual tasks from your portfolio as you discuss them.(This should take 2 to 3 minutes)
3. End with a short conclusion. You might say whether you are proud of your work, if you think it will help you in the future, or how the work represents your talent. (30 seconds to 1 minute)
4. Thank your audience for their attention.

You may use note-cards during your presentation. You are welcome to create a visual aid (poster, handout) but a visual aid is not required. You are encouraged to show samples of your work as you discuss them.
